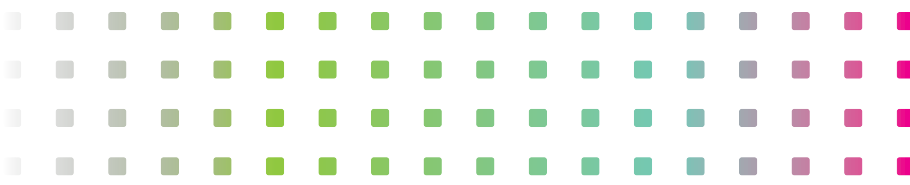

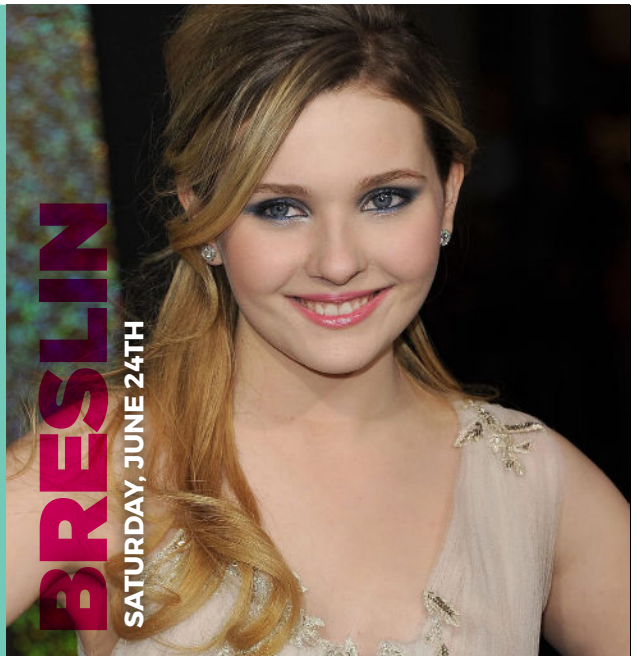
NEVADA WOMAN OF ACHIEVEMENT

Our **2023 Nevada Woman of Achievement, Berenice Chávez**, will be honored for her outstanding work as an editor. Berenice's credits include the **Netflix Documentary, Pamela, a Love Story**. A special screening of this film will be shown in conjunction with a conversation with Berenice on Friday night.

VANGUARD EVENT & NEVADA PREMIERE

This year Nevada Women's Film Fest (NWFFest) honors actor **Abigail Breslin** (Little Miss Sunshine) and director **Michelle Danner** for their work on the powerful historical drama, **Miranda's Victim**. Join us for the **NEVADA PREMIERE** screening, followed by a conversation with Breslin and Danner.

Abigail Breslin leads an all-star cast, which includes Andy Garcia, Ryan Phillippe, Luke Wilson, Donald Sutherland, and Mireille Enos. *Miranda's Victim* explores the story of the "Miranda Rights," the legal disclaimers police must recite upon the arrest of alleged criminals. Remarkably, very few people know the story of Miranda and how it involved a brutal sexual assault on a teenage girl, a case where "silence" is often forced on victims, their own rights and pursuit of justice unheeded and unheard. **Breslin** is a committed advocate and survivor herself of domestic violence and sexual assault.
